## MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

The Catholic Catechism teaches about three states of the Church (N. 954):

*“When the Lord comes in glory and all his angels with him, death will be no more and all things will be subject to him. But at the present time some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is’.*

With **All Saints day**, November 1<sup>st</sup>, the Church invites us to raise our hearts and minds to the immense multitude of men and women from all walks of life who followed Christ here on earth and are already enjoying his presence in Heaven. This Solemnity is being celebrated since the eighth century.

Pope Saint John Paul II described these saints this way: *“they were humble yet great labourers for the growth of the kingdom of God in history. They knew how with the help of God to conserve and perfect during their life the sanctification they received in Baptism”*

The Preface of Mass on All Saints says: *“Heavenly Father, today we keep the festival of your holy city the heavenly Jerusalem. Our brothers and sisters the saints now sing your praises forever around your throne, and their glory fills us with joy. Our communion with them through your Church gives us inspiration and strength as we hasten on our pilgrimage of faith, eager to meet them.”*

Regarding **All Souls Day**, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Catholic Catechism makes this teaching: *“the Church in its pilgrim members, from the earliest days of the Christian religion, has honoured with great respect the memory of the dead; and because it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins’ (2 Maccabees 12) she offers prayers for them.”*

Pope Saint Paul VI spoke about the infinite value of the Mass as the most important prayer we have to offer up for the souls in purgatory. He also said we can offer our prayers for their benefit, especially the Rosary, our work, the sufferings of life, and all kinds of difficulties we experience, as well as the indulgences we merit for them during our earthly existence.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (N. 1478) describes how indulgences work: *“an indulgence is obtained through the Church who, by virtue of the power of binding and loosing granted her by Christ Jesus, intervenes in favour of individual Christians and opens for them the treasury of the merits of Christ and the saints to obtain from the Father of Mercies the remission of the temple punishments due for their sins. Thus the Church does not want simply to come to the aid of these Christians, but also to spur them to works of devotion penance and charity.”*

An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead. (cf. Catholic Catechism N. 1471)

On the All Souls day, an indulgence for someone who has died can be obtained by doing **three things**:

- 1) Participate at Mass and humbly receive Holy Communion;
- 2) make a worthy sacramental confession on All Souls Day or a day or two on either side of All Souls;
- 3) pray for our Holy Father, Pope Francis (say devoutly an Apostles Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary.)

Remember that the Blessed Virgin Mary prays with us and for us, now and at the hour of our death. Her title, Refuge of Sinners, is especially comforting to all of us on our pilgrimage of faith, in this life and in the time of purification.

MASS REFLECTION

*He began to cry out. (Mark 10:47)*

**B**artimaeus makes it perfectly clear: when we really want something, we will push through the obstacles in order to get it.

Bartimaeus pushed through the opposition of the crowd that tried to keep him from Jesus. He wanted to be healed, and nothing would stop him. In a similar way, the “crowds” of the world seem to want to keep us from Jesus and from receiving his healing touch. They are telling us to be content with who we are. “Jesus can’t help you,” they tell us, “so just accept the status quo instead.”

The problem is, what the world offers can leave us restless, unfulfilled, always searching, always looking for the next best thing to make us happy. All too often, our desires for God’s peace and love become fleeting moments that get shouted down by the influence of the crowd.

Each day, in certain ways, we face opposition similar to what Bartimaeus faced. He was wrapped in a “cloak” of comfort (Mark 10:50). The crowd told him to stay put and to be content with his blindness. “Jesus cannot help you; you’re not worth his time.” But Bartimaeus was desperate. He refused to listen to the crowd. As a result, Jesus heard him, and Bartimaeus gladly threw off his cloak and ran to where Jesus could wrap him in divine love.

Follow Bartimaeus’ example! The crowds of the world want all of your time, but you don’t have to follow them. Today and every day, you can throw aside the “cloak” of partial comfort and spring up to meet Jesus (Mark 10:50). Let him wrap you in a cloak of grace and healing.

Remember this as well: while the crowds of the world want to keep you from Jesus, there are also crowds of disciples who want to follow him. They can help you grow in your faith. Find people who pray together. Find a Bible study. Join people who serve the poor. Surround yourself with people who share your desire for Jesus. Join them as you follow Jesus “on the way” (Mark 10:52).
