WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY

This is the theme chosen by the Holy Father Pope Francis for the 53rd World Communications Day, to be held in 2019:

«We are members one of another» (Eph 4,25). From network community to human communities.

The theme underlines the importance of giving back to communication a broad perspective, based on the person, and emphasizes the value of interaction always understood as dialogue and as an opportunity to meet with others.

This calls for a reflection on the current state and nature of relationships on the Internet, starting from the idea of community as a network between people in their wholeness. Some of the prevailing trends of the so-called social networks ask us a fundamental question: to what extent can we speak of a real community in the face of the logic that characterizes some communities on social media? The metaphor of the web as a community of solidarity implies the construction of an “us”, based on listening to the other, on dialogue and consequently on the responsible use of language.

The choice of the theme for the 2019 Message confirms Pope Francis’ attention to the new communications environment and for social networks, especially, where he is present in the first person with his @Pontifex account on Twitter and @Franciscus on Instagram.

The Archdiocese of Vancouver is blessed with its own weekly Catholic newspaper, the **BC Catholic**. With this newspaper we are given helpful updates on world, national and local events from a Catholic point of view as well as faith - building articles to ponder.

At the Cathedral we sponsor almost 1100 subscriptions (including 505 email subscriptions) to the BC Catholic for our registered parishioners. This costs us over \$400 every 3 weeks (or over \$20,000 per year)

ON SUFFERING

If God loves us, why does He allow people to suffer mental torment and worry? Why are hospitals filled with people who are sick or who are physical wrecks because of unbearable inhibitions, guilt, lack of self confidence, loneliness and frustration? This God must be sadistic rather than loving.

In His providence, God has enabled humanity to grow much through the centuries in its capacity to deal with the evils that plague it, including the ones you mentioned. Advances in sciences of all sorts make possible our management, if not cure, of physical and emotional illnesses that once were mysteries. Our first responsibility, then, is to use the medical care and cure to help us cope with our hurts.

On a deeper level, we can offer these words to ponder: Jesus choose not to remove suffering and death from our human condition, even for himself. For the first time, and for all time, he brought to a pained humanity the promise of meaning, healing and hope in its hurt.

The suffering you describe would lead us to think that



God is sadistic only if the pain were inflicted by Him. It is not. Indeed, God could stop it only by removing our opportunity for free choices, which would mean taking away our potential for love. God allows us to hurt ourselves and does all He can to reduce the hurts and ease the pain because He knows that in the end, the love that grows amidst that pain will make it all worthwhile. Of that, our Lord Jesus himself is the supreme proof and assurance.

MONDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY WITH DEACON RICHARD



MASS READINGS

FIRST READING Jeremiah 1.4 -5, 17-19
I appointed you a Prophet to the nations.
RESPONSORIAL Psalm 71
R. My mouth will tell O Lord, of your deed of salvation.

SECOND READING I Corinthians 12. 31 - 13.13
Faith, hope, and love abide; the greatest of these is love.

GOSPEL Luke 4.21-30
Like Elijah and Elisha, Jesus was not sent only to the Jewish people.

MASS REFLECTION
Love never fails. (1 Corinthians 13:8)

Many people—scholars and everyday believers alike—consider today’s first reading to be the greatest chapter in all of Scripture. Using just thirteen verses, Paul gave us a beautiful description of love that we could spend a lifetime praying about.

Simple and succinct, Paul puts love where it belongs: on the top of the list. Speaking in tongues like the apostles, prophesying like Isaiah, understanding the mysteries of faith like St. Thomas Aquinas, giving away everything we own like Mother Teresa—it means nothing if love is not involved.

Paul also acknowledges that none of us love perfectly. Using analogies, he calls our love childish. It’s as if we were looking at life through a dark, distorted mirror. Paul acknowledges, in other words, that we all make mistakes. We all use bad judgment. We all hurt other people—especially our loved ones. We try our best, but sometimes our best just isn’t good enough. Not yet, at least.

Like Paul, St. Peter also puts love at the top of the list. He sees love as being the most powerful force in the world. It’s so powerful, in fact, that it “covers a multitude of sins” (1 Peter 4:8).

Love understands all of this and can heal all of this—even the mistakes and poor judgments that are more a matter of bad choices than sins. If you have been hurt, remember that your love can bring healing, both to yourself and to the one who hurt you. Even if your love is partial or tinged with some regret or a bit of anger, it can still make a difference. Jesus always sees the love, and he always blesses it.

Love is not about being perfect. It’s about trying our best and asking forgiveness when we fall.

In prayer today, ask Jesus to fill you with the desire and the strength to love with the same love that he has for you. Try to be quick to love, quick to forgive, and quick to ask forgiveness. Remember, love always wins.

“Lord, teach me to love more deeply each day.”
