MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

In the Catholic Church calendar, we remember St. Monica on August 27 and St. Augustine of Hippo on August 28. They both lived in the 4th Century in Northern Africa and Italy.

St Monica is the patron saint of mothers. She had a great influence on people in her life: through her prayers and humble example her pagan husband and her cantankerous mother-in-law became Christians. Augustine was her renegade, sinful son and was converted eventually through the prayers of Monica and the teachings of St. Ambrose, the bishop of Milan. Augustine became the bishop of Hippo and one of the greatest Fathers of the Church.

In his writings Augustine admits that before he was baptized, he prayed "Lord make me pure, but not yet." That is a prayer that all of us can appreciate. Like Augustine, who knew what God wanted from him and who was caught up in the life he was leading, we are hesitant in giving our lives to God. We fear that God may take us up on our offer to Him! We don't fully trust God.

There is a Christian website that is very helpful for men to grow in the ways of trusting God through prayer and self denial. It is intended for married men but is also very helpful for single men. Here are some sentences from this website, www.e5men.org.

"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the Church and gave Himself for her. [Ephesians 5:21]"

The e5 Man fasts for his bride as a way to imitate Jesus as described by Saint Paul in his letter to the Ephesians, chapter 5 (for which the e5 is named). e5 Men fast in unison on bread and water for at least one 24 hour day per month - preferably the 1st Wednesday of the month.

Jesus made a bodily sacrifice on the cross for his bride the church to present her to God the Father "without spot or wrinkle." (Eph 5, 27) By fasting for our earthly bride and joining our sufferings to Christ's we intercede for grace for our brides. At the same time our act of bodily love in union with


By making this sacrifice for the women in our lives we live out the essence of the gospel through a very particular act of self denial. To lay down one's body out of love for another is the central message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Membership is not limited to married men. For single men, their fast may be dedicated to their future bride (known or unknown). For widowers or those unlikely to get married, the beneficiary of their fasts may be for a daughter, a sister, or a granddaughter, a former girl friend or any woman who might be in great need. For the consecrated celibate man the benefit of their fast can be for the benefit of the community they serve or for consecrated celibate women, or for the Church at large."

Please check out www.e5men.org, a great support for Catholic men to grow in the ways of prayer and self-denial for the love of the women in their lives. St Monica and St Augustine would approve!!

MASS REFLECTION

People will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south. (Luke 13:29)

Going to a Catholic church in another country can be a real eye-opener. The language or accent might be different. The liturgy might have a different flair. And the people in the pews might not look like your fellow parishioners. That’s part of the beauty of the Church!

In today’s Gospel, when someone asks Jesus whether only a few will be saved, Jesus is quick to broaden his perspective. The heavenly banquet table is very large, he says! Yes, the gate is narrow, and it takes effort to enter. But that doesn’t mean heaven will be empty. History tells us that many, many people have been more than willing to enter through that narrow gate. The result? All the great saints and heroes of the faith will be reclining at table with a multitude of people: men, women, and children from every race and nation, from every cultural and economic background. The Lord is not stingy when it comes to drawing people to himself. In fact, the more the merrier!

The key is entry through the narrow gate. That’s the action of faith that unites us. Whether you’re from the north, south, east, or west, a prince or a peasant, it doesn’t matter. If you’ve entered through that narrow door—if you’ve turned to the Lord in faith and Baptism—you belong in God’s kingdom. You have a place reserved for you at the banquet table of the Lord.

Now, just as you are a part of the people of God, so are the people in your community, everyone who serves side-by-side with you at your parish. But so are people who speak a different language or whose culture or economic status is very unlike your own. So are people in prison cells and in homeless shelters. So is the annoying neighbor down the street whose faith is known to God alone. In God’s eyes, everyone is equally deserving of his love. Because God wants everyone in his kingdom. So let’s make space next to ourselves at the Lord’s banquet table.

“Lord, help me to welcome anyone who comes to you in faith.”
