## MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

A very good website to help us with our questions about living out our Catholic faith is Catholic.com. Fr. John Dietzen has written a Q & A column for many years. Here is a sample of his help. Someone asked: "Is it possible to forgive?"

*"Through the years I have been very badly hurt by several people, especially when I was younger.*

*I know there is a mandate from God that we are to forgive those who offend us, even those who do grave injustice against us. I am finding it so difficult to forgive these people deep in my heart. What can someone like myself do?"*

The number of questions I receive on this subject surprises me. People, obviously very good people, find themselves spiritually frustrated and guilty because they, as you, feel they cannot forgive and don't know what to do about it.

From my own pastoral experience, it seems that a large part of the problem stems from the old admonition to forgive and forget.

In most cases, especially when the hurt has been grievous, it is impossible to forget, even after many years.

The mistaken supposition then is that one has not forgiven the wrongdoer. We forgive others by letting go of resentment and the desire to take revenge, to inflict harm in return on those who have violated us. Memory of what happened may remain.

It is normal and healthy to be angry when someone does violence to us or to someone we love, and that anger may reappear when the memory of injuries recurs.

But again, that does not rule out forgiveness. Anger, just as the other normal human passions, is necessary and proper. It's how we respond to anger that is important.

When we cease to harbor the desire for vengeance, when we give up our need to get even, to punish the other person for what he or she did, we are well on the road to forgiveness.

Two very ordinary actions can be signs that, however much we still hurt, we are in the process of forgiving. First, we can pray for the other person. When we do that, we are also, even if we don't realize it, praying for our own healing. And second, we can be willing to treat the other person with civility and charity. We don't need to seek him or her out, and we don't need to be friends or buddies. But we should be open to simple Christian decency if the situation presents itself.

I know that many who say they cannot forgive have already reached this point.


If not, it is something to aim for with God's help and much more sensible than trying to suppress our memories.

I pray all of this in Jesus' precious name and by whom all forgiveness and healing is made possible. Amen.

## MASS REFLECTION

*Reflection on the correct use of earthly goods.*

Telling the Parable of the dishonest but very crafty administrator, Christ teaches his disciples the best way to use money and material riches, that is, to share them with the poor, thus acquiring their friendship, with a view to the Kingdom of Heaven. "Make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous mammon," Jesus says, "so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal habitations" (Lk. 16, 9).

Money is not "dishonest" in itself, but more than anything else it can close man in a blind egocentrism. It therefore concerns a type of work of "conversion" of economic goods: instead of using them only for self-interest, it is also necessary to think of the needs of the poor, imitating Christ himself, who, as St Paul wrote: "though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (II Cor. 8, 9).

It seems paradoxical: Christ has not enriched us with his richness but with his poverty, with his love that brought him to give himself totally to us.

Here one could open up a vast and complex field of reflection on the theme of poverty and riches, also on a world scale, in which two logics of economics oppose each other: the logic of profit and that of the equal distribution of goods, which do not contradict each other if their relationship is well ordered.

Catholic social doctrine has always supported that equitable distribution of goods is a priority. Naturally, profit is legitimate and, in just measure, necessary for economic development.

In his Encyclical Centesimus Annus, John Paul II wrote: "The modern business economy has positive aspects. Its basis is human freedom exercised in many other fields" (n. 32). Yet, he adds that capitalism must not be considered as the only valid model of economic organization (cf. *ibid.*, n. 35)...the logic of sharing and solidarity prevails, it is possible to correct the course and direct it towards an equitable, sustainable development.

May Mary Most Holy, who in the Magnificat proclaimed: the Lord "has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent empty away" (Lk. 1, 53), help Christians to use earthly goods with Gospel wisdom, that is, with generous solidarity, and inspire politicians and economists with farsighted strategies that favour the authentic progress of all people.
