COMING TO HOLY MASS AT THE CATHEDRAL

The directives of the BC Health Authorities continue to allow the Cathedral to offer the public celebration of Mass for **fifty people or less**.

To sign up for Sunday Mass, please visit the Cathedral website www.holyrosarycathedral.org every **Monday**. **A link to register for the upcoming Sunday Mass will be posted on the website on Monday between 9 AM - 12 PM.**

Weekday Masses (Mon. - Sat. 12:10 PM, 5:10 PM) are first come, first serve, sign in at the door (50 person limit in effect).

Once Mass begins, the doors are locked and you will not be allowed to enter if you arrive late. No public washrooms available at this time.

SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR MASS

Beginning **Sunday, October 18** the Cathedral will open the 8 PM Mass for people to attend. **For this Mass there will be no earlier pre-registration required.** Entrance will be on a first come, first serve basis. **50 person limit will be in effect.**

MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

Remembrance Day is celebrated in Canada on November 11th. The Canadian Bishops offer us three aspects to this special day to ponder and to act on:

First, we pause and pray to remember those who died in war and to pray for the victims of aggression and inhumanity around the world.

Second, Remembrance Day is a special day to pray for peace. We should consider what we are doing as individuals, as families, as faith communities and as a nation to bring God's peace to the world. The peace Jesus promises comes from an inner conversion of the human heart rather than from an imposed external order (like the temporary forced order brought by the Roman emperors and modern equivalents such as dictators and tyrants).

Third, we can make this a special time to rededicate ourselves by prayer and action to the ideals Jesus gave us in the Beatitudes.

Ask God to show you what He wants you to do to promote peace and justice with others. It could be some special prayers, fasting or generous action of service.

THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

DECREE EXTENDS INDULGENCE FOR THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED THROUGHOUT NOVEMBER

The Apostolic Penitentiary announces modifications to the Plenary Indulgence for the deceased during the month of November.

PLENARY INDULGENCE DURING MONTH OF NOVEMBER

Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups from forming where prohibited, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of 1 to 8 November. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed.

PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR FEAST OF ALL SOULS' DAY

Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to All Souls' Day, 2 November, this year, it can be obtained not only on the preceding or succeeding Sunday, or on the actual Feast day, but on any other day of the month chosen by each member of the faithful. In this case, the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the other requirements associated with a Plenary Indulgence.

THE HOMEBOUND

For anyone who cannot leave their home for various reasons, including anti-Covid restrictions, they too can obtain the Plenary Indulgence by "uniting themselves spiritually to other members of the faithful". In this case, the condition of being "completely detached from sin" and the intention of completing the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence remain. These conditions are Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions.
