ON FATHERHOOD

What does it mean to be a father? Pope Francis once remarked that "to be a father of a family is a vocation, it is a most beautiful calling because it makes us grow, in a very special way, in the image and likeness of God; to be a father really means to fulfil oneself fully because it is to become similar to God."

Many studies have shown that households with a capable, involved father are more likely to produce adults who continue in their faith life, as well as maintain strong marriages. However, this vocation is not a solitary one; Our Heavenly Father is a model, he did not just make us and leave it at that. He continues to provide and to love us throughout our whole lives. Here there is a detail in this that we often fail to notice: we most often refer to God 'Father', because it is a way in which we truly understand the kind of relationship that God wants with us. And we call Him Father, because we are all His children, fruit of His love who, in creating us, has made us capable of loving and in need of loving and being loved. This was what Saint John Paul II meant when he wrote in his first encyclical letter *Redemptor hominis* that "if a human being does not love, if he is not loved, he does not find meaning in his life" (n. 10).

The vocation of the Fatherhood goes beyond that of the biological function of procreation or just being a good provider: Fathers (and mothers too) teach us what it means to love and to be loved. It is one of the reasons that the family is called a school of love and the father of a family is the first image of God children will encounter.

Being a father, is truly an authentic vocation: this is attested to by the children themselves, who when seeing their parents loving, understanding, forgiving and helping each other, see how beautiful marriage is! Likewise, when the image of the parents is negative, kids give up on the

vocation of marriage, thus affecting their children's future. On Father's Day this Sunday, we get the opportunity to celebrate and thank the men who are a constant source of love and inspiration in our lives; the men who take care of us, who provide for us and who by their example teach us the meaning of love. We thank even those who in some ways have come short of the expectations we have. We are grateful for those who have gone to the Heavenly Father, and above all we ask God the Father to continue to inspire men to answer to the call of marriage and fatherhood with a heart full of love and courage.

A PRAYER FOR FATHERS

HEAVENLY FATHER, you entrusted your Son Jesus, the child of Mary, to the care of Joseph, an earthly father. Bless all fathers as they care for their families. Give them strength and wisdom, tenderness and patience; support them in the work they have to do, protecting those who look to them, as we look to you for love and salvation, through Jesus Christ our rock and defender. **R.
