WORLD DAY OF PRAYERS FOR VOCATIONS

This Sunday's liturgy centers upon the image of the Good Shepherd. The Shepherd's sacrifice gave life to his wayward sheep and brought them back to the fold. Saint Peter reminds Christians



what Christ has done in his suffering for them: "by his wounds you have been healed. For you were straying like sheep, but now have returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls" (1 Peter 2, 25).

And so the whole Church prays in this liturgy that the "continuing work of the Redeemer will bring us eternal joy" (prayer over the gifts at Mass).

At Mass we also ask God the Father to "give us new strength from the courage of Christ our shepherd, and lead us to join the saints in heaven" (opening prayer at Mass).

The fourth Sunday of Easter is also always the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Christians are invited to reflect on the meaning of God's call and to pray for vocations in the work of the church. Christ the Good Shepherd continues to lead His people through His bishops, priests and deacons.

The Canadian Bishops write that "priestly, and religious vocations should be a

constant concern in the hearts of God's people throughout the year". Please keep up your prayers for our young people to respond with courage and generosity to God's call to serve in the church. Make these prayers for vocations more deep by adding in some self denial.

Thank you for your support and prayers to promote Vocations in the Church.
