PENTECOST

This Sunday we celebrate Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and the foundation of Our Holy Mother the Holy Church of God. It was originally called "feast of weeks" or "Shavuot" and took place seven weeks after the feast of first fruits. Originally it had a focus of thanksgiving for the harvested crops, but soon a historical sense was added to it: the fact of the covenant and the gift of the Law were celebrated on this feast.

In the History of the Church this feast was sometimes referred to as second Passover or Easter. The current liturgy of the Church, although it maintains it as the highest solemnity after Easter, does not intend to make a parallel between the two; on the contrary, it seeks to form a unity in which Pentecost is highlighted as the conclusion of the Paschal season. That is to say, as a feast of fullness and not as a feast of beginning. Therefore, it cannot be separated or seen apart from Easter and the resurrection of Christ.

In this sense, Pentecost is not an autonomous feast in honour of the Holy Spirit but it is a completion of the work of Easter and how the gift of the Holy Spirit is given to the disciples after Our Lord Ascended into Heaven. The Holy Spirit was promised by the Risen Christ and given to them nine days after His Ascension so that the Apostles can do the task of making disciples of all nations and bringing them to baptism. However, we must not see the Holy Spirit as just coming to the Apostles and then leaving. The Holy Spirit comes to us in many ways, but it is especially highlighted at our Confirmation to complete the work of our Baptism and so that we can receive the promised gifts of the Holy Spirit, gifts that we need to build up the Church. The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of God.

These gifts of the Holy Spirit are very important so that we may understand what it means to be a follower of Christ, but it does not end there: these gifts are not for our own sake only, but also for the good of the community.

Through the gifts of the Spirit, the Holy Spirit can -if we allow Him- guide, comfort, encourage and teach us. These gifts help us to walk uprightly before the Lord and prevent us from being deceived by false doctrines. And with these we help build up the Church and encourage others to encounter Christ.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit will manifest differently in different people, but it is important to value the gifts that God has given us and the gifts that others have. All gifts are necessary for the proper functioning of the Church and we should not undervalue any gift. Whatever gift God has given you, be grateful for it and use it faithfully for the building of the domestic church at home, the local church at the Parish and for the Church at large.

By virtue of the gift of the Holy Spirit and his gifts we are charged to follow the example of the apostles and make disciples of all nations.
