FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION

February 2nd is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This feast is also known as the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Candlemas. This feast commemorates the occasion when the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph, in obedience to Jewish law, went to the Temple in Jerusalem to be purified 40 days after the birth of her son, Jesus, and to present him to God as her firstborn (Luke 2, 22 - 38).

In the early Church it was often celebrated on 14 February, 40 days after the Epiphany, in accordance with the practice of celebrating Christmas on that date in the East. Among the Orthodox it is known as the *Hypapante* ('Meeting' of the Lord with Simeon).

Pope Benedict XVI said that the Feast of the Presentation “is the meeting point of the two Testaments, the Old and the New. Jesus enters the old temple, which is the new temple of God: he comes to visit his people, thus bringing obedience to the Law to fulfilment and marking the beginning of the last times of salvation.”

This Feast also commemorates the encounter of Simeon and Anna with Our Blessed Lord. When Simeon sees the Christ Child, he bursts in prayer and recites the canticle the Church recites at Compline, the *Nunc Dimittis*. This one, along with the *Magnificat* and the *Benedictus*, are the three principal canticles used in the liturgy of the Church.

After speaking about Our Lord, Simeon spoke to Mary of her role in accompanying her Son in His redemptive suffering. Simeon also reveals Mary's own mission of intercession and compassion for us, her spiritual children.

This feast is also called the Purification because it commemorates the ritual purification, necessary for worship, that is part of the Jewish way of life.

Our Lady, though morally pure, fulfilled her religious obligations by being purified forty days after the birth of Our Lord. Throughout her life, the Blessed Mother was always obedient to the Will of God, in this case expressed through the laws given to Israel through Moses.

We also call this feast Candlemas because on this day the candles that are used throughout the Liturgical year are blessed. Pope Saint John Paul II said: ‘The Christian traditions of East and West have intertwined, enriching the liturgy of this feast with a special procession in which the light of the candles, both large and small, is a symbol of Christ, the true Light who came to enlighten his people and all peoples.”
